

MORPHIA KILLED TWO CAMDEN BOYS

Chemist Beringer Makes His Report to Prosecutor Lloyd—Another Witness in Murder Case

George M. Beringer, the chemist who made an analysis of the organs of John Houseman Coffin and Walter Price Jennings, who were found dead near Haddon Heights, two weeks ago, has made a report of his findings to Prosecutor Lloyd.

It was stated yesterday by an official in a position to know that Mr. Beringer found traces of enough morphia in each of the boys' stomachs to kill a man. What seems to puzzle the authorities is to learn in what manner it was administered. It is not believed it was given them in a liquid and there were no traces of food such in which it could have been secreted.

The authorities yesterday discovered another witness who saw the three boys together in the field a short distance from where the bodies were found. They refuse to divulge his name.

No day has as yet been fixed for the trial of the alleged murderer, Young Paul Woodward, but it is believed if Prosecutor Lloyd's health will permit the case will be disposed of early in November. Woodward spends most of his time in smoking cigarettes and discussing with all who will converse with him his chances for being sent to State prison.
