

OVER IN CAMDEN

Samuel Thomas, 65 years old, of 625 South Eighth street, has been missing for a week, and his relatives fear he has met with foul play.

Neighbors contend that the child is neglected by its parents and has to depend upon the charity of others for something to eat. The case was recently investigated by the Overseer of the Poor, and the father, who is a baker, promised to make better provision for his children. The mother left home some time ago.
