Missing from his home for a week, Andrew Miller, 25 years old, of 923 South Ninth street, is being sought by the police at the instigation of his wife, who fears that some harm has befallen him.

For mixing mortar on an asphalt street, in violation of a city ordinance, Andrew Surenco, 24 years old, of 710 Locust street was fined \$25 yesterday by Recorder Stackhouse.

Taken ill in his office at the City Hall Detective Brothers is in Cooper Hospital undergoing treatment for a threatened attack of appendicitis.

For the death of his wife, who was killed when the carriage in which she was riding was struck by a train at Laurel Springs on August 21, 1915, William Steiber yesterday brought suit for \$25,000 against the Atlantic City Railroad Company.
