

# CAUGHT LEAVING N. J.

## WITH LOAD OF GOODS

### Charged With Being Implicated in Robbery of Ton of Metal, Man Is Sent to Jail

As he was trying to cross the river with a load of zinc and lead which he had in a covered wagon, Frank Romano, 26 years old, of 603 Fitzwater street, Philadelphia, was taken into custody in the Pennsylvania Railroad terminal at the foot of Federal street, Camden, yesterday by Special Office Bruett and Policemen Lyons and Jesse Smith. He was taken to the Camden city jail, where he is being held on a charge of being implicated in the stealing of nearly a ton of the metal.

When the man was stopped and the nature of his load revealed it was seen that it was such material as is used by the railroad company on its electric road. No report of a robbery had been made, but after an investigation had been under way for a short time it was learned that the storehouse of the company at Delair had been looted.

### Cannot Use Name of "Owls"

In an opinion given by Vice Chancellor Laming in Camden yesterday the Grand Lodge Improved Order of Owls is restrained from using that name or any of a similar nature containing the words Order of Owls or "Owls." The suit was brought by John W. Taltot, Supreme President of the national body of Owls. Some time since a number of members of a local lodge of Owls seceded from the parent body and formed a rival organization known as the Grand Lodge Improved Order of Owls. They had not gone far before the regular organization employed counsel and action was taken against the use of that name with the result that the restraining order has been advised.

### Locates Alleged Fugitive

After being traced from place to place since last August, Detective Brothers, of Camden, has located at Pittsburgh John Tompkins, who is alleged to have been connected with John Miller, alias Zabinski, who robbed many homes in Camden and the suburban districts while the people were away for the summer. Both men are alleged to have had a room on Lombard street, Philadelphia, where several hundred dollars' worth of loot was recovered. Detective Brothers captured Miller and he is now in State Prison. A clue was uncovered which pointed to Pittsburgh and Tompkins' hiding place was located. He is being held pending requisition papers.
