

WOMAN LEFT HOME, CREATED BIG SCARE

Disappearance of a Farmer's
Wife Caused Excitement in
Camden County

The lower end of Camden county was aroused yesterday over what at first was supposed to be a murder mystery such as the famous Leconey and Miller cases of several years ago. The excitement was caused by the disappearance of Mrs. Sadie F. Groff, aged 35 years, of Haddon Heights. Her husband reported to Prosecutor Lloyd, in Camden, yesterday, that Mrs. Groff had gone to Haddonfield Thursday afternoon to make some purchases. As the route lay along a lonely road, Groff was of the opinion that his wife had met with foul play when she failed to return home.

County Detective Cherry was assigned on the case by Prosecutor Lloyd. Accompanied by Groff and a score of his neighbors, the officer scoured all the surrounding woods and thickets. They were about to give up in despair, when they were notified that the woman had returned home during the afternoon.

Mrs. Groff, a frail appearing woman, refused to say anything further than that she had gone to Camden, where she had spent the night in a boarding house.
