

MUST NOW ANSWER TO MURDER CHARGE

Victim of Gloucester Shooting;
Died Last Night in Cooper
Hospital—Son in Camden Jail

Arnold Schallor, the aged Gloucester City man, shot by his son Harry on Tuesday night, died in the Cooper Hospital, Camden, last night shortly after 9 o'clock. Schallor and his wife Catherine were shot in the legs by their son and both were taken to the hospital. Because of his age, 70 years, the father was not expected to survive the amputation of a leg, which had been deemed necessary. Mrs. Schallor is improving. She is in an adjoining ward and has not been informed of her husband's death for fear the shock will result fatally. The information is also kept from Mrs. Mary Powell, Mrs. Schallor's mother, who is 100 years old.

The son, who is locked up in the county jail, refuses to say anything, although on the night of the shooting he declared to County Detective Cherry that he was not sorry for his deed.
