

PLENTY OF MIX UPS CAUSED BY BLAZE

Fire Chief's Horse Ran Away, Store
Was Wrecked and Two Victims
Went to Hospital

South Camden was thrown into a turmoil yesterday afternoon indirectly through a slight fire at the Dunn Oil Cloth Works, at Railroad avenue and Jefferson street. A vat of oil boiled over and Charles Hampton, of 2124 Miller street, was terribly burned. He was removed to the Cooper Hospital. When the blazing oil set fire to the place an alarm was turned in. On the way to the fire the carriage containing Chief Elfreth dashed into the moving van of John Schmidt, at Broadway and Chestnut street. The horse ran away and collided with the awning pole of the Story Furniture Company, at Sycamore street, the structure being partly wrecked.

Beneath the awning Harry Haines, a blind man, of 232 Kaighn avenue, was playing a life for alms. The noise startled him, and when he attempted to get out on the way the frenzied horse dashed over him. Haines was taken to the Cooper Hospital, suffering from lacerations and contusions pretty much all over the body.

The fire at the oil cloth factory did less than \$25 worth of damage.
